



College Enrollment Over the Past Five Years: 2008-2012






Enrollment Status

Number of Full-Time and Part-Time Students




Enrollment Status

Type of Students Enrolled in Credit Courses




Types of New Students

Type of New Students Enrolled in Credit Courses at TCC





Comparison of Students Enrolled by Age








Enrollment and Unemployment

Summary

- Enrollment across the board is down slightly, even in distance learning courses
- Stable in number of continuing students
- More students enrolled part-time
- Factors contributing to TCC Fall 2012 enrollment:
 - Changes in local economy
 - Changes in financial aid regulations
 - Decrease in high school graduates within service district
 - Increased competition from for-profit institutions

Summary

- Overall, nearly 40% of our students come from outside the College's tri-county service district
 - Largest drop from Southeast Florida, our largest source outside the service district
- Slight decline in percentage of students receiving financial aid, with increase in amount awarded



- Retain current students
- Attract more nontraditional students
- Increase our outreach to targeted groups
