Course Outline:

This 40-hour CJSTC course is designed to introduce new field training officers, or officers interested in becoming FTO's to the following topics: 1) role of the FTO program; 2) components of a successful FTO program; 3) roles and responsibilities of the FTO officer; 4) responsibilities of the FTO in the learning process; 5) structure of the field training evaluation; 6) daily observation report; and 7) remedial training.

Course Objectives:

- Define the goal of the FTO program and list 5 primary roles of the FTO
- Explain the liability issues of the FTO and define leadership as it relates to FTO
- Demonstrate proper counseling techniques
- Understand the evaluation procedure

Who Should Attend:

To attend this training the participant must be a Florida law enforcement officer, corrections officer, probation officer, or support personnel for a Florida law enforcement organization. For salary incentive courses, all officers outside Region III/XV must provide written authorization by agency representative requesting attendance and election of salary incentive or mandatory retraining.
