Baseball Field House

Tallahassee Community College unveiled the Wayne and Betty Edwards Family Baseball Field House on Tuesday evening, January 25. The event was attended by TCC Foundation President's Circle members, former TCC baseball players, and members of the Edwards family.

The facility was named in honor of Wayne and Betty Edwards who have been involved in TCC athletics for many years. Wayne worked on the hiring committee that brought Coach Mike McLeod to TCC. Wayne and Betty's son, Chris, attended TCC and played first base on the baseball team in the 1990s. The Edwards family donated \$100,000 to the Raising Our Game: TCC's Campaign for Athletics.

"Supporting the TCC Athletics Program in their first ever campaign was a very easy decision for my family as we know first-hand the benefits of this program and what it can mean to those seeking to play post-high school sports," said Wayne Edwards. "We are pleased to be able to provide support."

During the unveiling event, TCC's President Jim Murdaugh, thanked members of the TCC Foundation President's Circle donors and the Edwards family for their support of the College.



FIRST CLASS *Project*

The campaign for the FIRST CLASS Project started in 2016 with a list of 50 classrooms to underwrite for renovation and a total of \$1,250,000 to raise to cover the renovations. Today, every classroom has an underwriter and 34 have been completely renovated. The remaining 16 classrooms will be renovated over the next two years. We were happy to unveil seven of the most recently renovated classrooms in the spring.

Kim & Todd Engstrom, underwriters for a Biology Classroom, attended their classroom unveiling which was complete with a demonstration of the new technology by Dr. Wilbert Butler, science faculty member at TCC. Interestingly, it was her support of science and his love of higher education that brought them to support the FIRST CLASS Project.

Kim Kelling Engstrom is the Director of Content and Community Partnerships at WFSU. Education has always been an important focus for Kim, both personally and in her work. One of her main projects at the station is

The American Graduate initiative which provides WFSU Public Media the opportunity to convene community partners, highlight effective programs, link resources, identify the gaps, and create a more robust career and college pipeline.

Dr. Todd Engstrom is a retired ecologist specializing in birds, particularly the red-cockaded woodpecker, forest management, and fire ecology in the southeastern United States. During his career, he worked with the Cornell Laboratory of Ornithology, Tall Timbers Research Station, Florida State University, the US Forest Service, and The Nature Conservancy.

Todd's perspective on their gift was a personal dedication to his father. "My father was one of the co-founders of Valencia College in 1967. He always believed in the community college system, and this gift is a way that I can honor his spirit."

Their donation of \$25,000 was matched dollar for dollar, providing for a \$50,000 renovation of a biology classroom at the College which now bears their name.

Welding Lab

It is often said that it takes a village to raise a child. The same can be said for establishing a scholarship, launching a program, or creating a new space on campus – and the creation of TCC's state-of-the-art Welding Technologies Laboratory (WTL) was no exception. This project was a collaboration between the US Department of Commerce: Economic Development Administration, TCC, the TCC Foundation's President's Circle, and an anonymous donor.

Located in TCC's Kim B. Williams Advanced Manufacturing Training Center (AMTC), the lab was unveiled this past spring. It is a 30-booth facility which mirrors an actual welding work environment, providing a realistic workplace for our students.

"This facility will expand our capacity to provide more individuals with the opportunity to pursue a high-demand career while also addressing our region's increased need for industry professionals," said Jim Murdaugh, president of Tallahassee Community College. "We are proud to play our part in ensuring our local talent meets the needs of our community."

TCC offers both an Introduction to Welding course which can be completed in a matter of months and a longer welding program that can be completed in just four semesters and consists of at least 65% hands-on activities. While enrolled in the program, students have the opportunity to earn a Construction OSHA Safety Card, a National Center for Construction and Education Research (NCCER) Welding certification, and membership in the American Welding Society. These industry credentials are not only recognized in the State of Florida but registered into a national database.

College Innovation Fund

Each year the Foundation, through the support of the President's Circle, funds grants through our College Innovation Fund.

This was created to assist faculty and staff in implementing transformational projects designed to create student enrichment, innovation in the classroom, and advance the college.

This year we awarded three grants focusing on student engagement and student success.

Little Free Art Studio

Created by Lindsey Smitherman-Brown, Communications and Humanities faculty,

This project provides monthly art kits geared towards children in the Chattahoochee area. This service-learning project for her students has been very well received! Research shows that students who are involved in art are four times more likely to be recognized for academic achievement. Lower-income and socioeconomic students are twice as likely to graduate compared to their peers with no arts and have a five-time lower dropout rate.

Physics Labs Using Technology Project

Created by Gregory Brown science faculty,

This project provides students the ability to collect data with their smart phones and streamline their efforts in class as well as see the connections of physics between the classroom and their everyday lives.

Pivo Science Project

Created by Erika Williams, science faculty,

This project introduces artificial intelligence tracking to traditional lecture and laboratory settings allowing instructors to live stream in-person classes to asynchronous online students.

All three projects will be presented at the College Innovation Fund Forum in the spring of 2023. The forum allows grant recipients the opportunity to present the final outcomes of their projects.

Scholarship Stories

Twelve new scholarships have been created over the last year. Some were created to honor a loved one's legacy, some were created to fill a need, and some were created to encourage entry to the trades. All created a pathway to success for our students. Here is a snapshot of a few:

32304 Scholarship

Tallahassee's 32304 ZIP code has more residents living in poverty compared to any other zip code in the Sunshine State, according to Florida Chamber of Commerce President Mark Wilson. TCC's main campus resides in the 32304 ZIP code and the College has partnered with the Florida Chamber of Commerce, local businesses, and community leaders to work toward reducing poverty and increasing prosperity in 32304. Late last summer, a local couple learned of our efforts and donated \$50,000 to create the 32304 Scholarship to support students attending TCC who live in the 32304 ZIP code.

Dr. Bart Carey Scholarship

The Friends of Dr. Bart Carey mobilized to create a scholarship to honor their dear friend, a local dentist who passed away in 2020. Led by his long-time friend, Chuck Urban, this group put together a poker tournament to raise funds. They partnered with the TCC Foundation to launch this event, and 100 individuals participated, raising \$30,000 to create this scholarship honoring their friend.

As a dentist and partner at Dr. Carey & Jones Pediatric Dentistry and Orthodontics, Bart was a trusted colleague and mentor to those within the business and across the dental industry. Locally, Bart lectured regularly to dental hygiene students at TCC. The funds will be used to support students entering TCC's dental programs.

The Willis D. and Frances H. Booth Integrity in Law Enforcement Scholarship

Created by their three daughters Deanna, Diane & Rebecca, this scholarship is for full-time students enrolled in the law enforcement program at TCC's Florida Public Safety Institute.

Chief and Mrs. Willis D. Booth moved to Tallahassee in 1968 where Chief Willis served with the newly established Bureau of Law Enforcement (currently FDLE) where he served as Special Agent, director of criminal investigations, and director of mutual aid helping establish police standards. Of the many contributions he made, Chief Willis counted mentoring generations of law enforcement officers as his most gratifying. Frances H. Booth was involved in every aspect of church fellowship and service by teaching Sunday school, Vacation Bible School, and planning and preparing for social outreach activities for the congregation. Music was a great joy to her, and she ensured that all her children received some form of musical training. Frances and Willis were married for 71 years.

Cynthia Webb DeShazo Wingfield RN Nursing Scholarship

Brigadier General William (Bill) Webb and his wife, Montse, along with Robert (Bob) and Joanne Webb, established the Cynthia Webb DeShazo Wingfield, RN Nursing Scholarship. Cynthia, daughter of Bill and Montse and niece of Robert and Joanne, passed away this past spring. This is the fifth scholarship established by the Webb family at TCC.

"Cynthia was a nurse all her life and she valued her profession so much," said Brigadier General Webb. "Our family wanted to do something to remember Cindi, to honor her lifetime of selfless service, and for her legacy to live on with future generations of nurses."

Cindi attended TCC where she earned a degree in Nursing. She lived her dream of helping others through healthcare and was particularly passionate about helping uninsured patients with breast cancer receive care. The Cynthia Webb DeShazo Wingfield, RN Nursing Scholarship will be available to single mothers pursuing a career in Nursing and will be awarded to students in the Fall.



DeLopez Athletics Scholarships

Tom and Sandy DeLopez, both former college athletes, created the DeLopez Baseball Scholarship and the DeLopez Women's Basketball Scholarship. These are the first privately-funded athletics scholarships at TCC.

"Sports are so formative for young people and they need support to persist in athletics," said Sandy DeLopez who played women's basketball at the collegiate level. "The life lessons gained from playing sports, such as the value of working together, mutual trust and dependence on one another, are so important. If you look at women CEOs and leaders, you'll find that many, played sports. I would not be where I am today had it not been for my own experience playing basketball, which is why it is so important to me to establish this scholarship for TCC's women's basketball players."

"Sandy and I recently attended the opening of the new baseball field house. There, I saw fresh, enthusiastic young men playing a game they love while getting an education," said Tom DeLopez. "It really reminded me of the 1963 football freshman class that I was a part of at FSU. We came to Florida State to get an education and play a little football. Those of us who made it through the first year pretty much all graduated and had very successful careers. Intercollegiate athletics requires discipline, determination, and to learn time management. These young athletes are getting those attributes and habits and it will help them throughout their entire lives and it has helped us."



Lamont and Johnnie Cook Scholarship

The Cook Family created the Lamont and Johnnie Cook scholarship to provide financial assistance to students pursuing an associate degree in building and construction management at TCC.

"I attended classes at TCC and am proud to count myself among its distinguished alumni. My company, Cook Brothers, Inc., has done a tremendous amount of work on the TCC main campus and the Florida Public Safety Institute. To be able to establish a scholarship that combines my love of this institution and my profession was something special for me and my wife, Johnnie," said Lamont Cook.

GRANTS

It was a historic year for the Department of Grants and Special Projects. We were awarded \$11,549,505 across 29 different grants throughout the College.

- Award of \$2M from the Florida Department of Education for the development of a new charter high school focused on Career and Technical Education. TCC was named as one of only five colleges in the state selected to create a charter school because of our track record of preparing our community's workforce. The school is expected to open in August 2023.
- Award of \$1.5M for the expansion of our Pre-Apprenticeship Programs in partnership with the Florida Department of Corrections. This program will be located in Florida Department of Corrections institutions in Gadsden, Taylor, and Liberty counties. The grant allows us to grow our pre-apprenticeship programs and provide workforce training in Brick and Block Masonry, Welding, Culinary Arts, HVAC, Electrical, CNC Machining, Carpentry, and Plumbing.
- Award of \$1.4M for our Eagles Connection Program, a postsecondary comprehensive transition program for students with intellectual disabilities. This funding provides scholarships for these students and their families as well as programmatic costs for running the program.
- Award of \$250,000 from Bank of America for the creation of the Medical Lab Tech Program. Both local area hospitals communicated a need for medical laboratory technologists and have expressed an interest in having an educational program offered here in our community. With the support of Bank of America, we have been able to create this new program and will be welcoming students in the Fall of 2022.
