




GENERAL STUDY TIPS



DON'T CRAM

Easier said than done.

- Time management
- Pomodoro method
- Take breaks
- Prioritize sleep
- Avoid marathon study sessions in favor of shorter focused highintensity studying

READING IS NOT STUDYING


Reading the textbook or your notes does not equal study time!

- Research backs up
 ACTIVE study strategies
- If reading is preferred, use SQ4R to boost understanding & retention.

SPEAK UP

Ask for help as early and often as possible. Write down your questions and ask them.

- Office hours
- Tutoring
- Success coaching
- Study groups



GET TO KNOW THESE 7 STUDY STRATEGIES

SQ4R: survey, question, read, recite, record, review

Retrieval Practice: practice tests; flashcards, teach

Spaced Repetition: preview, view, review

Leitner System: flashcards; easy/medium/hard

Concept/Mind Maps: visually organize connections

Notes: rewrite; color/highlight; Cornell, paraphrase

Interleaving: switch between two subjects



TIME SAVING TIPS

THE POMODORO TECHNIQUE



STEP 1 **CHOOSE THE TASK**





STEP 3

BEEPS

WORK ON THE TASK UNTIL TIMER



STEP 4 **TAKE A SHORT BREAK OF 3-5 MIN**





REPEAT THE CYCLE 4 TIMES TAKE A LONGER BREAK AFTER 4 SESSIONS

CHOP IT UP

- Chop up your large assignments, projects, and study time into smaller tasks.
- Write it down.
- Focus on one at a time & cross off as you go.

Helpful Tips

READING + NOTETAKING TIPS

SQ4R

S = SCAN
each page quickly.

Q = QUESTION as you scan.

R = READ

(does not mean reading every word.)

R = REFLECT

think about what you've just read.

R= RECITE

aloud to yourself as you read; talk to yourself.

R = REVIEW

what you've just read.

Cues

- * Main ideas
- * Questions that connect points
- * Diagrams
- * Prompts to help you study

WHEN: After class during review

Notes

- * Record the lecture here, using
 - * Concise sentences
 - * Shorthand symbols
 - * Abbreviations
 - * Lists
- * Skip lots of space between points

WHEN: During class




